### Major achievements completed

- Fundraising efforts: Ran a variety of fundraising events and activities (see below)
- Community-geared events: Leading and supporting Fun Night, Trivia Night and Movie Nights.
- Clean-up and school grounds development: Improvements to the school grounds through tree planting, gardening and clean-up efforts throughout the year.
- Transport arrangements: Support toward a review of the Transportation Demand Management at the school, including looking into funding for crossing guards and additional parking changes. This supports a safer walking/cycling environment.
- Transparency: Regular communication with parents through flyers, emails and an updated council website.
- 1% challenge: SWC council will support other students in our city with 1% of our fundraising being donated to the Education Foundation

- Pizza program: Pizza offered to students on Monday once a week.
- QSP Magazine: Magazine subscription program offered to parents and guardians.
- Fun Night: A year-end celebration that encourages participation by all students and their families.
- Trivia Night: An evening of trivia for parents and children.
- Subway: Subway program offered to students.
- Burritos: Burrito program offered to students.
- Booster Juice: Booster Juice program offered to students.
- Equator Coffee: Reduced cost coffee, from local roaster, provided with a set amount donated back to SWC.
- Movie Nights: An opportunity for families to enjoy child-friendly movies together.

- Caregiver's Day Gift Shop: Provided an opportunity for children to shop for caregivers
- Loveable Labels: Sold personalized labels to help keep track of kids' stuff, with a portion of proceeds supporting school council

- Student discretionary fund.
- \$75 per classroom teacher: A per classroom donation to assist cross curriculum activities and events.
- Field Trip allowance: Donation to support field trip activities.
- School-Led Initiatives: Including support of in-class activities and events (e.g. mathletes)
- Teacher Requests: Teachers presented to the School Council one-off funding projects outside of regular funding streams.
- Yard Improvements.
- Grade 7/8s: Funding given to Merivale High School in recognition of previous SWC students moving school.
